#### All different All Equal youth symposium focuses on integration for disabled young people

A symposium of European youth campaigners take place in Mollina, Spain, from 12 to 16 September. The participants look for ways to better integrate young people with disabilities, by reviewing new practices and regulatory frameworks.

Entitled "Youth in the integration process of people with disabilities", the symposium is part of the Council of Europe's All Different, All Equal Youth campaign. Organised in conjunction with the Spanish Youth Institute (INJUVE) and the Spanish Labour and Social Affairs Ministry, it will look for ways to better integrate young people with disabilities, reviewing new practices and regulatory frameworks, and fostering networks across borders. The aim will be to push for a strong commitment to equal opportunities for disabled young people and lobby governments to commit more money to removing obstacles in areas such as education, employment and mobility.
