EU-MIDIS 5 Data in Focus report: Multiple discrimination

The Fundamental Rights Agency publishes its first report on multiple discrimination.

The FRA interviewed 23,500 people with an ethnic minority or immigrant background in all 27 EU Member States. Key questions on grounds of discrimination are comparable with results from a Eurobarometer survey of the majority population. The findings show that people belonging to 'visible' minorities, such as Roma and people of African origin, are more likely to suffer multiple discrimination that is, being discriminated on more than one ground-than other minorities. Another relevant ground for discrimination that could increase the experience of multiple discrimination are socio-economic factors such as living with a low income. Read more in the full report:
