

INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE ELIMINATION OF RACIAL DISCRIMINATION 21 MARCH

On 21 March 1960, in the township of Sharpeville, South Africa, police opened fire and killed 69 people who were peacefully demonstrating against apartheid's "pass laws."

The United Nations General Assembly subsequently declared that day, 21 March, the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination, and called on the international community not only to commemorate that tragedy, but also to work together to combat racism and discrimination wherever they exist.

40 MEASURES FOR COMBATING RACISM AT SCHOOL

The European Commission against Racism and Intolerance (ECRI) has just produced a list of measures which are specific and simple to implement in schools, in a recommendation published on March 21. "Across Europe, racist incidents among young people are on the rise. School is the place to make or break our efforts to stop this trend", stated Terry Davis on this occasion. The President of the ECRI, Eva Smith Asmussen, added: "Quality education, which is compulsory and equally accessible to all, is the key to combating racism and racial discrimination in our societies".
