Alert Fund for Youth Activities is a Netherlands-based independent youth fund. It supports progressive projects for young people by providing small grants to youth change agents and youth organisations globally.

Themes of focus for Alert Youth Fund are peace and dialogue; social, economic and political participation; environment and sustainability; emancipation, gender and sexual rights; as well as human rights and justice. Alert Youth Fund subsidizes single and small-scale (inter)national projects for and by young people. The amount of funding is maximum €1.500,-. Applications from outside the Netherlands need a Dutch reference person, or a trusted reference in the country itself, such as a person working for an internationally renowned NGO.
